In 2003 the average monthly wage of Korean woman was about 1 446 000 won, at the current rate equal to \$ 1,400. Men on average received 2 303000 won, or 2236 dollars. Thus, in 2003, women in Korea received 62.9% of men's wages.

While making the research we found a lot of information about gender discrimination in professional sphere and understood that women and men have equal rights to be what they want to be. The involving of different people in diverse spheres of our life, we enhance opportunities for sustainable growth and people development.
